

**THE ROBERT SHUKER SCHOLARSHIP FUND
2019-2020 ACADEMIC YEAR SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION**

INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTION

PURPOSE:

The Robert A. Shuker Scholarship Fund was established in 1993, to honor the late Judge Robert A. Shuker, Associate Judge of the Superior Court of the District of Columbia. Its primary purpose is to find and assist young people in obtaining an education that have few financial resources, but a burning desire to learn, achieve, and serve the public.

ELIGIBILITY:

The Robert A. Shuker Scholarships are available on a competitive basis to individuals, who are residents of the Greater Metropolitan Area of Washington D.C. and have been admitted to and will be attending a law school accredited by the American Bar Association (ABA) on a full-time basis during the fall of 2019 and the spring of 2020, which leads to a J.D. Degree.

AWARD AMOUNTS:

Each scholarship is traditionally in an amount between \$15,000.00 and \$20,000.00.

APPLICATION PERIOD AND DEADLINES:

All completed applications in hardcopy **MUST** be postmarked on or before **Friday, April 12, 2019**, to ensure consideration. Applications with all supporting documentation **MUST ALSO** be submitted electronically to contact@shukerscholarship.com by the same deadline. **No late or incomplete applications will be accepted or considered.** If an acknowledgment of receipt is desired, please enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope. Scholarship recipients are selected by the Board of Directors of The Robert A. Shuker Scholarship Fund. The Scholarship Fund reserves the right to change its criteria for awarding these scholarships without notice. The Grantees are selected on an objective and nondiscriminatory basis and are chosen on the basis of financial need, demonstrated community service, future interest in public service, prior scholastic ability, recommendations from instructors, and conclusions that the members of the Board of Directors draw from a personal interview as to the individual's motivation, character, ability, and potential. The Board reserves the right to reconsider any awards when there is a material change to the information provided.

Those applicants selected for interviews will be notified no later than June 21, 2019.

Due to the volume of applicants, we will only contact those students who are selected.

d. Submit a copy of your most recent Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form or CSS/Financial Aid Profile;

e. Complete and submit the attached Statement of Income and Expenses for the 2019-2020 academic year **along with a copy of the first page of your most recently filed tax return with the Social Security number redacted.**

Note: Failure to submit **ALL** documents and materials identified in items **8, 9 and 10** above will result in the rejection of the student's application from consideration.
